In 2014 appointed by the European Commission to ICLEG with a mandate to work on the company law reform in EU. 2013-2015 member of the ministerial Expert Group for Amicable Settlement of Commercial Disputes, as of 2015 member of the Expert Group on Economic Law, as of 2016 member of the Expert Group on Simple Joint-Stock Company. As of 2016 Leader of a team appointed by Poland's Minister of Science and Higher Education to elaborate a reform of Polish academia. Personally and institutionally involved in the law reform process in transitional economies (Ukraine and Moldova). In 2014, team leader of a study project commissioned by the EU Delegation in Kiev to assess the approximation level of Ukrainian company law to EU standards and practices – an undertaking to provide recommendations on company law reform in Ukraine. "Dziennik Gazeta Prawna", a leading Polish business daily, included Arkadiusz Radwan on their list of "50 Most Influential Lawyers in Poland" (ranked 24th in the 2013 edition, and 40th in the 2015 edition).
